10a. Does behavior occur only with stimulation (i.e. Rubbing, etc.), only spontaneously, or both with stimulation and spontaneously?

10b. If behavior occurs with stimulation, does it occur every time the stimulation occurs?

11. Has the animal ever been injured? \_\_\_\_\_ How? \_\_\_\_\_

12. Does the animal self-mutilate?

What is the duration of the mutilation component?

13a. Does it fall off things or run into things during an episode?

13b. Does it appear to be aware of doing so?

13c. Does it injure itself by falling or hitting things?

14. Does it still engage in normal maintenance (eating, drinking, grooming) behavior?

15. Does it still engage in normal social behavior (playing, soliciting, petting, interaction with other pets)?
